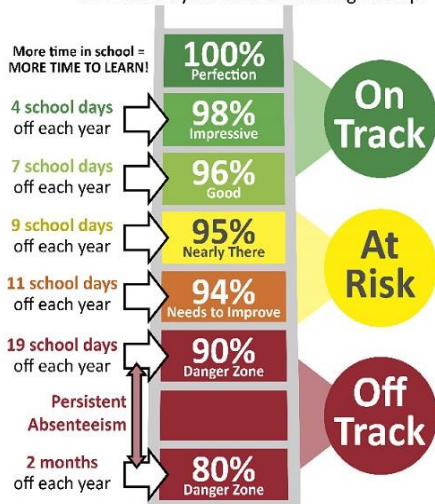
School Dinners
