INTRODUCTION

Greenhill Primary School has its own distinctive uniform. There are good reasons for this, the most important being that a uniform helps to create a sense of community and is suitable for such a working environment. It can also help to instil pride and support positive behaviour and discipline. It is also of considerable benefit for security reasons that students should wear school uniform. A school uniform removes distraction and avoids discrimination that may be caused by an individual's style of dress, and allows students to concentrate on learning. We have kept our uniform smart but simple and is seen as a set of work clothes for work. Unless otherwise stated, all items of uniform may be worn by both boys and girls.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

The school uniform consists of:-

BOYS Grey or black long or short trousers

White or yellow polo shirts

Grey or white socks

Emerald green sweatshirts

Black shoes

P.E./Games Kit - gold T-shirt

- emerald green shorts

- black pumps

GIRLS Grey or black skirts, culottes or pinafore dresses

Grey or black trousers

Yellow or white blouses or polo shirts Emerald green sweatshirts or cardigans Lemon, yellow or green gingham dresses

White or grey socks or tights

Black shoes

P.E./Games Kit - gold T-shirt

- emerald green shorts or cycling shorts

- black pumps

Outdoor Coats – any sensible outdoor coat may be worn.

P.E. bag to hold the P.E. kit – the kit should always be available for the children's lessons.

Training shoes are not allowed in school unless requested by staff for games lessons.

The school respects the right for wearing certain items of clothing for religious or traditional reasons and will take this into consideration for P.E. and the arrangements for swimming lessons.

JEWELLERY

The wearing of jewellery is generally discouraged due to Health & Safety reasons. However the school allows the following:

IDENTIFICATION AND OWNERSHIP
